About DSCYF

Created in 1983 to enable efficient services for children and families experiencing child maltreatment, delinquency and behavioral health challenges by avoiding fragmentation and duplication

- Mission: Engage families and communities to promote the safety and wellbeing of children through prevention, intervention, treatment, and rehabilitative services
- Vision: Safe and healthy children, resilient families, strong communities
- 4 Divisions (DFS, DYRS, DPBHS, DMSS) with approximately 1400 employees







DSCYF Strategic Plan

Developed between 2020-2021 and launched January, 2022

- Included input from staff and stakeholders
 - Strengths:
 - Strong, trusting, and positive relationship with advocates, public safety, other department leadership and with the Courts
 - Significant work and training related to becoming trauma-informed
 - Skilled staff
 - Opportunities:
 - Strengthen youth and family voice

GRANT OVERVIEW



■ Time Frame: March 31,2023 - March 30, 2024

Amount: \$1,000,000

■ **Purpose**: Support the development and implementation certification systems for CCBHCs, establish Prospective Payment Systems (PPS) for Medicaid reimbursable services, and prepare an application to participate in a four-year CCBHC Demonstration program.

Goals and Objectives:

- Create systems for cross-agency coordination and stakeholder engagement.
- Establish Delaware's Prospective Payment System (PPS) for CCBHCs.
- Build Awareness of the CCBHC model and prepare for implementation.
- Develop state and provider data collection and reporting capacity necessary to fully participate in the CCBHC Demonstration.
- Establish certification infrastructure and process to certify at least 2 CCBHCs.
- Submit a CCBHC Demonstration application of March 2024.

WHAT IS A CCBHC?



- Improved access to and delivery of comprehensive integrated and coordinated community-based care for individuals across the lifespan with and at risk for mental illness, including substance use disorders (SUD).
- Anyone seeking help for a mental health or substance use condition, regardless of their place of residence, ability to pay, or age may access services (i.e., children, adolescents, transition aged youth, adults, and geriatric populations).



*CCBHC organization will deliver directly the majority (51% or more) of encounters across the required services (excluding Crisis Services) rather than through DCOs.

Services for Armed Forces, Veterans, and their Families

- Must be delivered directly by a CCBHC (crisis services may be delivered by a state sanctioned alternative)
- Delivered by a CCBHC or a Designated Collaborating Organization (DCO)

Services must be provided for the full life span.



COMMITMENT AND COMMITTEES



Cross Agency Steering Committee


Role: Responsible for CCBHC planning, design and implementation of decisions.

Frequency: Monthly with mid-meeting conversations/communities.

Stakeholder Advisory Group

Role: Provide input to inform the development of the demonstration program. Provide actionable recommendations to guide outreach and engagement strategies, input on services necessary to address SDOH, and review public facing messaging.

Frequency: Bi-monthly
