Delaware Launches Groundbreaking Pilot Program to Reduce Opioid Deaths


The opioid crisis touches every corner and community in our state.

That's why I announced this week that Delaware will be the first in the nation to pilot a new harm reduction program designed to reduce lethal overdoses and save lives. Starting this holiday weekend, Delaware will be the first to offer a test strip to screen substances for fentanyl AND xylazine, a non-opioid tranquilizer that can lead to open wounds and amputation. Unlike fentanyl, there is no reversal agent for xylazine, making it even more crucial to detect.

This test strip, developed by Delaware-based SIVAD Diagnostics, is another tool to reduce harm to our residents and empower people to take their health into their own hands without stigma. This pilot program is aimed at supporting Delaware residents on the journey to recovery and will roll out statewide at Brandywine Counseling clinic locations and on the ground with Dr. Sandra Gibney and the Syringe Services Program.
